<p><b>My place and life</b></p>	<p><b>Revision of the basics:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> verb to be, subject pronouns, possessive adjectives and pronouns, Wh- words, prepositions of time, definite and indefinite articles, plural of nouns, demonstratives, possessive case, imperative, object pronouns.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> countries and nationalities, cardinal numbers, days, months, seasons, everyday objects, family members, describing people, places in town, giving directions.  <b>Civilisation:</b> the British Isles, the UK, Great Britain and some English speaking countries (the Republic of Ireland, the USA and Australia).</p> <p><b>Describing places:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> there is / there are, prepositions of place, verb to have got.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> parts and objects of the house, idioms with verbs to be and to have.</p> <p><b>Talking about one's daily routine:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> present simple (all forms), frequency adverbs.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> everyday activities.</p>

<p><b>Free time and food</b></p>	<p><b>Sports and leisure:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> verb patterns (verbs expressing like or dislike + -ing), modal verb can for ability, permission and request.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> free time activities, sports.</p> <p><b>Food:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> countable and uncountable nouns, quantifiers (some, any, no, a lot of, much, many, (a) little, (a) few, too much, too many, (not) enough).  <b>Vocabulary:</b> food and drinks, quantifiers and containers.  <b>Civilisation:</b> British meals.</p>

<p><b>Between present and past</b></p>	<p><b>The world of work:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> present continuous (all forms and functions), contrast between present simple and present continuous.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> jobs and careers.</p> <p><b>Memories and celebrations:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> past simple of regular and irregular verbs (all forms).  <b>Vocabulary:</b> dates and ordinal numbers, celebrations.  <b>Civilisation:</b> British Christmas.</p>

<p><b>The place I most like</b></p>	<p><b>Travelling:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> past continuous (all forms and functions), subject and object questions, contrast between past simple and past continuous, adverbs of manner.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> means of transport, holidays, nature.</p> <p><b>Shopping for clothes:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> comparative adjectives, superlative adjectives.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> clothes.</p>

Talking about future	<p><b>Weather and the environment:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> be going to future and future simple (all forms and functions).  <b>Vocabulary:</b> weather, the environment, natural disasters.  <b>Civilisation:</b> English stereotypes.</p> <p><b>Having fun:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> present simple and present continuous for future actions, may and might for possibility.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> entertainment, television and music.</p>

Have you ever...	<p><b>Life events:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> present perfect simple (all forms and functions), been vs gone, contrast between present perfect simple and past simple.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> relationships, biographies and life events, the news.</p> <p><b>Education and rules:</b>  <b>Grammar:</b> present perfect simple with ever, never, already, yet, still, just, for and since, modal verbs of obligation in the present.  <b>Vocabulary:</b> school subjects, school rules.  <b>Civilisation:</b> UK Educational System.</p>
